The Manurewa Bahá'í Centre is the centre for the Bahá'í faith activities in South Auckland. The area on which the main building stands is quite large, containing a separate building from the main building which provides facilities for study classes and other activities which are focused on moral empowerment and community service . There is a communal garden and a house for a caretaker. The main building is used for worship and meetings of a nature related to service in, and the support and development of the wider community. A large proportion of members of the Bahá'í community in Auckland are of Pasifika descent.
